# NPH DOMINICAN REPUBLIC PROJECT ACCOMPLISHMENTS

- Funded a new school room for the expanding population of the transition home in Monte Plata. This room can also serve as a day care facility and an after school gathering place for NPH and the surrounding communities.
- Erected two gaga ball courts, one at Santa Ana and one in Monte Plata.
- Painted one of the houses in Monte Plata as well as the main park area in Santa Ana.
- Constructed shelving for the doctor's office and built the foundation of a tree house in Monte Plata.





### THE BABY AND THE PRIEST

The picture is well-known among NPH staff and supporters and it hangs in Casa Santa Rosa in Monte Plata in the Dominican Republic. It was captured 65 years ago. The priest holding the tiny baby. Father William Wasson and Maria Avante.

Maria's mother died after giving birth to her in Mexico on July 7, 1959. She was the youngest of twelve who all were sent to NPH Mexico since they had no one to care for them. She grew up at Miacatlan completing high school and her year of service. She left NPH to live in Mexico City with her older brother, who funded her post secondary education as a legal secretary. She worked for Volkswagen until she moved to live with her sibling's sponsors, Bruce and Lois Daugherty in Naples, Florida, where she learned maintains a relationship with English from 1984 to 1986.

Maria is the mother of three children. She became an American citizen and took a new job as a transporter for a hospital. When she moved to Holly, Michigan, she worked at Chrysler in business management. When her youngest child was 8 months old, she was divorced and raised the children on her own until she met her current husband, John Radvansky.

After living in Michigan for six years. Maria researched the whereabouts of one of her sponsors, whom she had never met. She found his son on the internet, and he promptly informed his 93 year-old father that Maria wanted to reconnect with him. He was thrilled! Maria now has three grandchildren and she credits NPH for changing her life permanently for the better. She never knew the love of her father and mother, but she shared love among over 300 brothers and sisters and a priest who welcomed her into his arms so many years ago.
