St. Damien Pediatric Hospital

Dr. Pascale Gassant is the National Director of St. Damien Pediatric Hospital which is the only hospital wholly dedicated to pediatric and prenatal care in Haiti – a country of 11.5 million people. Without the valiant dedication of the people at St. Damien, several thousand children with treatable illnesses would suffer or die, and thousands of mothers would either perish in childbirth or not receive the necessary prenatal support that leads to bearing healthy children.

Beyond medical care, St. Damien also makes a positive impact on the economy and livelihoods of Haitians by employing more than 500 local people, including 300-plus Healthcare providers, such as doctors and nurses. Even as



Haiti continues to face extreme challenges, from political assassinations and earthquakes to poverty and unrelenting violence, the entire staff at St. Damien dedicates their lives to providing the most vulnerable children, women, and families with affordable and dignified health care.

St. Damien Pediatric Hospital is supported through private funding and with support from caring people around the world. St. Damien gives health and hope to the women and children of Haiti. Each year, on average, the medical team provides:

- ♣ More than 50,000 services to women and children
- ♣ Nearly 8,000 pediatric consults
- Nearly 2,000 emergency room visits
- ♣ More than 1,300 HIV consults
- And delivers more than 3.000 babies

<u>Adopt a Nurse -</u> These professionals work with the added stress of gunfire, kidnappings and failed government and infrastructure. The wild valuation of the local currency means they cannot rely on the purchasing power of their wages. Diesel fuel is required to be trucked through gang-controlled road check stop feed the electrical generators of the hospital. Water purification is required to avoid the spread of diseases. Some nights the staff will choose to sleep in the hospital rather than risk being kidnapped on the way home or on their return to work. Donate to our Adopt a Nurse program on our website.
